### **Elements of 2015 CenterState CEO Legislative Agenda Included in NYS Budget**

CenterState CEO's 2015 Legislative Agenda included a number of issues and initiatives addressed in the 2015-16 New York State Budget.

### **Economic Development**

Upstate Revitalization Initiative (URI) – The state budget included \$1.5 billion for which seven economic development regions will compete for three awards of \$500 million each. These transformative investments will be made over a period of five years. Submission date for the region's URI proposals is expected to be October 2015. The CNY Regional Economic Development Council is seeking input on ideas and projects. See page 3 for details.

**NUAIR Alliance** - The NUAIR Alliance received \$1 million to establish a data management system complementing the new range instrumentation system featuring equipment manufactured by SRC, Inc. and SaabSensis, being installed at Griffiss International Airport. The data management capability will provide NUAIR clients with the analytics and data reports they need for testing and certification of unmanned aerial systems.

Regional Economic Development Council Funding – \$150 million was approved for this year's Regional Economic Development Council competition.

**Redevelopment of New York State Fairgrounds** – \$50 million was included to make the site a 21st Century, year-round tourist and visitor destination.

Industrial Development Agency (IDA) Reform – Certain proposals making the funding and approval process for IDA-related projects more involved and lengthy were not enacted. These reforms would have limited use of local IDAs, diminishing the economic benefits of IDA financing as a tool for future projects.

### **Transportation and Infrastructure**

Port of Oswego and Inland Port – \$40 million was included for the Port of Oswego for port, rail and intermodal improvements, linking with the Port of New York/New Jersey and creating intermodal rail yards in Syracuse and Binghamton.


**Funding for Upstate Transit** – CENTRO and other Upstate transit systems will benefit from \$25 million in new funding to address operating deficits and avoid cutbacks in service this year.

#### **Government Modernization**

**Local Government Restructuring** – A significant new level of funding, \$150 million, is available for local governments for efficiency improvements, lowering the cost of government and reducing local property tax burdens. This fund will enhance the efforts of Consensus, the local commission on government modernization, to further government modernization in Onondaga County.

**Extending Design-Build** – Authorization for state agencies to use this cost saving approach for major projects is continued for two years and requires projects exceeding \$50 million to have project labor agreements.

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## UPSTATE REVITALIZATION INITIATIVE: SHARE YOUR IDEAS AS REGION COMPETES FOR \$500 MILLION

CenterState CEO will be working diligently over the next few months in partnership with the Central New York Regional Economic Development Council (CNY REDC) to develop a competitive Upstate Revitalization Initiative (URI) proposal. Through this initiative, seven Upstate regions, including Central New York, will compete for three, \$500 million investments in economic development strategies, programs and projects.

The URI is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity critical to the region's continued economic growth. Success in this process will require the region to pursue bold, visionary and transformational opportunities with broadbased, community-wide support. CenterState CEO is asking members to provide their best ideas about proposals that will:

- significantly alter the economic trajectory of the region
- · create jobs
- · accelerate net wealth generation
- leverage outside investment

These could be initiatives that impact a specific company or operation, relate to an industry sector and the markets it serves, or affect the entire regional economy during the next five years. The common thread is that initiatives must be transformative in nature, likely to attract significant outside investment (must demonstrate an ability to leverage a target ratio of at least \$5 of outside investment to \$1 of state investment), and advance the region's strategic priorities as identified in CenterState CEO's with the Brookings Institution (see box). The CNY REDC is responsible for submitting the region's URI plan.

### UP START SYRACUSE ENTREPRENEUR TO OPEN ALOHA JAPANESE RESTAURANT

Through the assistance of CenterState CEO's UP Start Syracuse program, emerging business owner, Zaw Nyein, will launch his restaurant this spring, bringing Japanese cuisine infused with Hawaiian flavors to downtown Syracuse. Nyein came to UP Start while he was actively searching for a restaurant location. UP Start assisted Nyein and his wife, Thaw, in making strategic decisions about their restaurant, including menu creation, branding and location.

Nyein, originally from Burma, worked as a geologist, but found little opportunity for economic mobility in his home country. He moved to Japan, then Hawaii, working restaurant jobs. When Nyein opens the doors to Aloha Japanese Bento Box at 217 S. Salina St., the menu will include a variety of entrees inspired by traditional Japanese and Hawaiian dishes, including custom Hawaiian hamburgers, slow-cooked Japanese noodles, deep-fried black bean fritters and a

### SYRACUSE COWORKS EXPANDS TO NEW SPACE

Syracuse CoWorks, a network of independent workers, entrepreneurs and freelancers, recently expanded to a new location on the second floor of the Common Space building at 201 E. Jefferson St.

The move creates a 5,000-square-foot office space that allows access to individual workstations, private conference rooms and the opportunity to network with like-minded professionals without committing to a long-term lease. Further amenities include large spaces for trainings or presentations, free WiFi, networked printers and a kitchen area.

Syracuse CoWorks was originally operated by 40 Below, the region's young professional group, out of The Tech Garden. Founding businesses Folksware Tech, Tech Geekery and Avenue 80 have now partnered to expand the facility. By offering a larger, more suitable coworking office space to the entrepreneurial and freelance



### In Hot Water? Help for New York State Homeowners

The Syracuse Center of Excellence (SyracuseCoE) headquarters is a whole-building test bed with laboratories where research produces innovative new technologies to promote sustainable, built environments. One goal is bringing the discoveries from these labs to market and ultimately into New York state homes, making them more comfortable and energy-efficient.

Water heating is the second-largest energy use in New York homes. The SyracuseCoE and CDH Energy Corp. initiated a NYSERDA-funded research project in 2011 to evaluate the newest water heating technologies. Data is collected from field-testing in New York homes and from the Domestic Hot Water Lab at the SyracuseCoE, and side-by-side water heating systems are compared for overall efficiency. This project helps consumers, manufacturers and installers understand the efficiency, costs and environmental impacts of both new and conventional domestic hot water systems.

The findings of the study are being used to develop a website, online in May, to help New York homeowners identify which technologies and products can improve efficiency and lower costs. The website will

answer basic questions about the variety of water heaters and fuel types available, as well as look at water usage and costs for different sized homes. More than 75 percent of our goods and services are procured through local or regional organizations. What advice would you give to other companies looking to move more of its purchasing to local suppliers?

Understand that you don't have to sacrifice quality - local and regional vendors provide the same quality of goods and services that you've come to expect from outside vendors. The Central New York Care Collaborative brings together more than 1,400 health care and community based service providers in Cayuga, Lewis, Madison, Oneida, Onondaga and Oswego counties.

The collaborative is led, in part, by several CenterState CEO members including St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center and SUNY Upstate, which serve as corporate members. Its board of directors includes Ann Gilpin, Oswego Health; Seth Kronenberg, MD, Crouse Hospital; John McCabe, MD, Upstate Medical University; Gene Morreale, Oneida Health Care; Leola Rodgers, Syracuse Community Health Center; Kathryn Ruscitto, St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center; and Kimberly Townsend, Loretto.

The goal of the CNYCC is to create a better system of care for all patients in this region, with a specific focus on Medicaid recipients and the uninsured.

CNYCC plans to integrate services, collaborate on patient care, improve regional health care quality and lower the costs of care under the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) program announced by Governor Andrew Cuomo last month, allowing the state to reinvest \$8 billion in federal savings generated by Medicaid reforms.

The \$8 billion reinvestment will be allocated as follows:

- \$500 million for the Interim Access Assurance Fund temporary, time limited funding to ensure current trusted and viable Medicaid safety net providers can fully participate in the DSRIP transformation without disruption
- \$6.42 billion for DSRIP including DSRIP Planning Grants,
   DSRIP Provider Incentive Payments, and DSRIP Administrative
- \$1.08 billion for other Medicaid Redesign purposes funding will support Health Home development, and investments in long term care, workforce and enhanced behavioral health services

These investments will address critical issues and allow the DSRIP program to promote community-level collaborations and focus on large-scale reform with a goal to achieve a 25 percent reduction in avoidable hospital use over five years.


