# UAS INDUSTRY ANNOUNCEMENTS SPOTLIGHT REGION'S LEADERSHIP, GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES

CenterState CEO and its team of partners are at the center of the state's efforts to lead the way in advancing the integration of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) into the National Airspace System. It recently organized and led a delegation of more than 20 private companies from Central New York and the Mohawk Valley to the AUVSI Xponential 2018 - the largest and most comprehensive trade show in the world for unmanned systems and robotics - in Denver, Colorado.

The group was united under the UAS Central banner, a new brand representing New York state's UAS assets and expertise. The robust group of partners in attendance combined

with a significant physical presence on the show floor provided companies that have been following UAS developments in New York state a chance to connect and explore research, manufacturing, partnerships and other business development opportunities in the region.

The show draws more than 725 manufacturers and 8,500 industry professionals in the UAS sector - making it a unique opportunity to broadly communicate the UAS Central message. A busy meeting schedule resulted in multiple companies scheduling visits to Central New York and follow on conversations regarding UAS opportunities in the region.

"Our participation at AUVSI this year proved to be extremely productive in helping advance our UAS business attraction efforts," said Andrew Fish, senior vice president of Business Development at CenterState CEO. "We walked away with 160 new contacts and potential leads and are working on four projects resulting

## **GOVERNMENT RELATIONS**

#### **Legislation to Expand Employee Stock Ownership Plans Moves Forward**

U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (D-New York) is sponsoring the Main Street Employee Ownership Act to expand programs and funding from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to assist with employee buyouts of the companies they work for and create cooperatives for that purpose. With so many "Baby Boomer" business owners who do not have succession plans, an Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP) can be an attractive option to keep these businesses operating. The alternative can often be shutting a business down, liquidation or selling, which could result in relocation of the business and its jobs. It is in the community's best interest for many of these businesses to continue operating and even expand. ESOPS' track records show they generally have increased productivity; that workers at employee-owned companies are paid 5 to 12 percent more than non-ESOP companies; have more retirement savings; are less likely to go bankrupt; and tend to stay in business longer.

Sen. Gillibrand recently held a press event discussing this bill at a local successful ESOP – Syracuse Label and Surround Printing, in North Syracuse. The same legislation is also moving through the U.S. House of Representatives.

If passed, the legislation would make changes to SBA policies and programs to make it easier for ESOPS to obtain the lending they need to purchase ownership of a business. If enacted, the SBA would conduct more outreach for ESOPS, the SBA Small Business Development Centers would provide services for ESOPS and the SBA would lead an interagency working group to develop recommendations to support and increase the number of ESOPS and increase coordination between federal agencies and employee ownership organizations.

#### **FAA Reauthorization Bill Passes the House**

The U.S. House of Representatives recently passed a five-year bill to provide stability for the nation's aviation industry, after several years of continuing resolutions. The bill now goes to the Senate. CenterState CEO will be urging senators Charles Schumer and Gillibrand to support this legislation. Full enactment will dovetail and complement New York state's significant investment in unmanned aerial systems (UAS) and the expansion plans for local businesses such as SRC, SRC's Gryphon Sensors, Saab-Sensis, Lockheed Martin and many others. The bill contains several items that are particularly favorable to the region:

It reauthorizes the FAA UAS Test Sites for six years, benefitting the test site at Griffiss International Airport (Griffiss) and the NUAIR Alliance.

It sets as a priority, pursuit of sense-and-avoid technology and UAS traffic management (UTM), which is a main focus of the work being done at Griffiss and with NUAIR Alliance members.

A provision sponsored by Rep. John Katko is included to create a remote air traffic control tower pilot program that could give smaller airports improved and safer air traffic control. There are firms in Central New York already working on this technology who stand to participate in this initiative.

from connections made at the convention that have the potential to bring 150 new jobs to the region over the next three years."

The delegation included the Syracuse City School District; Griffiss Airport, home to the New York UAS test site; GENIUS NY, the largest UAS focused business incubator in the world; Northeast UAS Airspace Integration Research Alliance (NUAIR), the organization that manages the test site and is constructing a 50-mile drone corridor; and Syracuse University, which is leading an effort on UAS-related policy.

During the week of the convention, the delegation was involved in several important announcements:

- NUAIR's new National Unmanned Systems Testing and Rating (NUSTAR) capability will be combined with the AiRXOS (a GE venture) Autonomous Service Platform to transform and streamline the safe and efficient integration of UAS into the National Airspace System. Clearly, the work being done under the UAS Central brand is attracting the attention of significant private sector companies.
- NUAIR selected partners to finish the infrastructure component of the drone corridor. This allows NUAIR to move forward on completing the infrastructure that will result in a corridor where Unmanned Traffic Management and Beyond Visual Line of Slight concepts can be tested and proven.
- The state of New York announced another round of the highly successful GENIUS NY competition. This announcement opens the door for six more companies to compete for \$3 million in investments and join the growing UAS ecosystem at The Tech Garden in Syracuse. The announcement has already generated 45 applicants for the latest round of the program. GENIUS NY also sponsored the STARTUP SHOWDOWN at the trade show,

## CENTERSTATE CEO PARTNERS WITH SCSD TO CREATE UAS INDUSTRY CAREERS PATHWAYS

Governor Andrew Cuomo announced the Syracuse City School District (SCSD) has been selected to participate in the latest round of the New York State Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) program, in partnership with CenterState CEO. The program prepares high school students for high-skill jobs in technology and other fields. Students will earn a high school degree, an associate degree at no cost to their families and will be first in line for jobs with participating companies when they graduate.

CenterState CEO and the Manufacturers Association of Central New York will partner with the SCSD through the program to provide advisory assistance and connections to industry partners in the unmanned aerial systems (UAS) industry. This can include assistance finding career coaches, internships and employment after completion of degree programs. Higher education partners include Onondaga Community College and Mohawk Valley Community College.



"As New York's economy continues to grow, the No. 1 concern I hear from employers is the need for more skilled workers," said Lieutenant Governor Kathy Hochul. "With this latest round of P-TECH Awards, New York is investing in our workforce by preparing high school students for jobs of the future in technology and manufacturing. Providing our students with the resources they need to succeed in the job market is a smart strategy for continued economic progress."

The SCSD was recently part of the delegation of partners that attended AUVSI Exponential 2018 in Denver, Colorado (see front page). The SCSD is one of the first districts in the country to include UAS in their curriculum. During development of the curriculum, SCSD needed to test students with a written and performance-based test. While a satisfactory written test had been established, finding a model for a performance-based test proved more difficult. At the show, SCSD was able to connect with a representative from the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) who had already created a performance-based test and gave SCSD permission to use it to complete their curriculum.

## GENIUS NY 3.0: ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS THROUGH OCTOBER 1

Following the success of the first two GENIUS NY competitions, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo recently announced the third round to continue to transform the economic landscape of Central New York by attracting the next generation of innovative entrepreneurs.

Applications are now open for CenterState CEO's GENIUS NY 3.0 program – the world's largest business competition and accelerator focused on unmanned systems. Building on regional industry strengths and emerging opportunities, the business competition targets companies in the unmanned aerial, ground, and marine systems and cross-connected platforms sectors. The six finalists of the year-



long residency will receive \$3 million in investment in the unmanned systems sector. The application period runs until October 1, 2018. Beyond investments, participants have access to some of the region's premier startup programming, including business planning, industry specific mentorship, and access to vetted service providers offering startup friendly terms. As part of this effort, participants are integrated into the larger regional effort to grow unmanned aerial systems in Central New York and the Mohawk Valley and will have access to world-leading infrastructure and testing assets when they come online. Participants also receive stipends for operating capital and subsidized rent, and will also have opportunities to connect with investors for follow on funding.

Rick Clonan, VP of Innovation and Entrepreneurship at CenterState CEO said, "This program has proven itself over the past two rounds as a groundbreaking tool for growing industry-leading unmanned systems companies. Over two years, we have invested nearly \$6 million in 12 high-quality teams, all of which have benefited from the program. In addition to these investments, teams benefit from the region's multi-dimensional ecosystem that combines technology, innovation, standards and certification and public policy. There is no other program that offers this level of investment or these resources."

## CNY TALENT TASK FORCE DEVELOPING STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS WORKFORCE NEEDS

The availability of talent is consistently raised as one of the key challenges facing businesses and firms in Central New York (CNY). While the demand for talent is not exclusive to the region, many of the region's fast growing industries feel stymied in expanding in CNY by the inability to attract the talented workforce they need. At the same time, CNY has long been known as a 'talent generator' and consistently attracts more than 130,000 students to the larger 12-county region's 36 colleges and universities every year.

As part of the 2017 Regional Economic Development Council competition, New York State challenged each region to identify workforce development strategies and shrink the skills gap through industry and educational collaboration. To achieve these goals, partners in the region established the Central New York Talent Task Force to develop a strategic talent plan by this summer aimed at filling the middle to high skill talent needs of the Council's priority industries. These industries include advanced manufacturing; finance and insurance services; health care; agribusiness; life sciences; software and internet services; engineering and architectural services; thermal and environmental controls; and unmanned aerial systems/aerospace.

The Task Force recently concluded its research, which paired comprehensive data analysis on the region's leading occupations, in demand skills, and persistently unfilled jobs with qualitative interviews of more than 40 companies. The research brings some key regional opportunities and challenges into focus:

- Many of the region's leading industries are experiencing growth, yet many struggle to attract middle to high skill talent. For example, to date in 2018, more than 4,500 jobs have been posted in the region's priority industries. Forty-four percent require a bachelor's degree or higher.
- The demand for skilled talent is expected to increase as a retiring workforce creates skills gaps and job vacancies. Just over a fifth of the region's labor force are baby boomers.
- · Most of the skilled talent that does move to the region appears to have a prior connection to Upstate New York.
- Though many industries feel strain in attracting talent, an acute mismatch exists in health care between current and projected demand and supply.
- Finding and retaining diverse candidates is a top challenge felt across the region.
- The region's colleges and universities provide a strong pool of entry level talent though many companies desire a closer connection to curriculum development.

As the Task Force moves toward concluding its work, its focus will shift towards developing strategies and interventions to address these key opportunities and challenges. It is expected that the Task Force will release those proposed actions in the summer.


